Cordyline australis 'LELC01' 

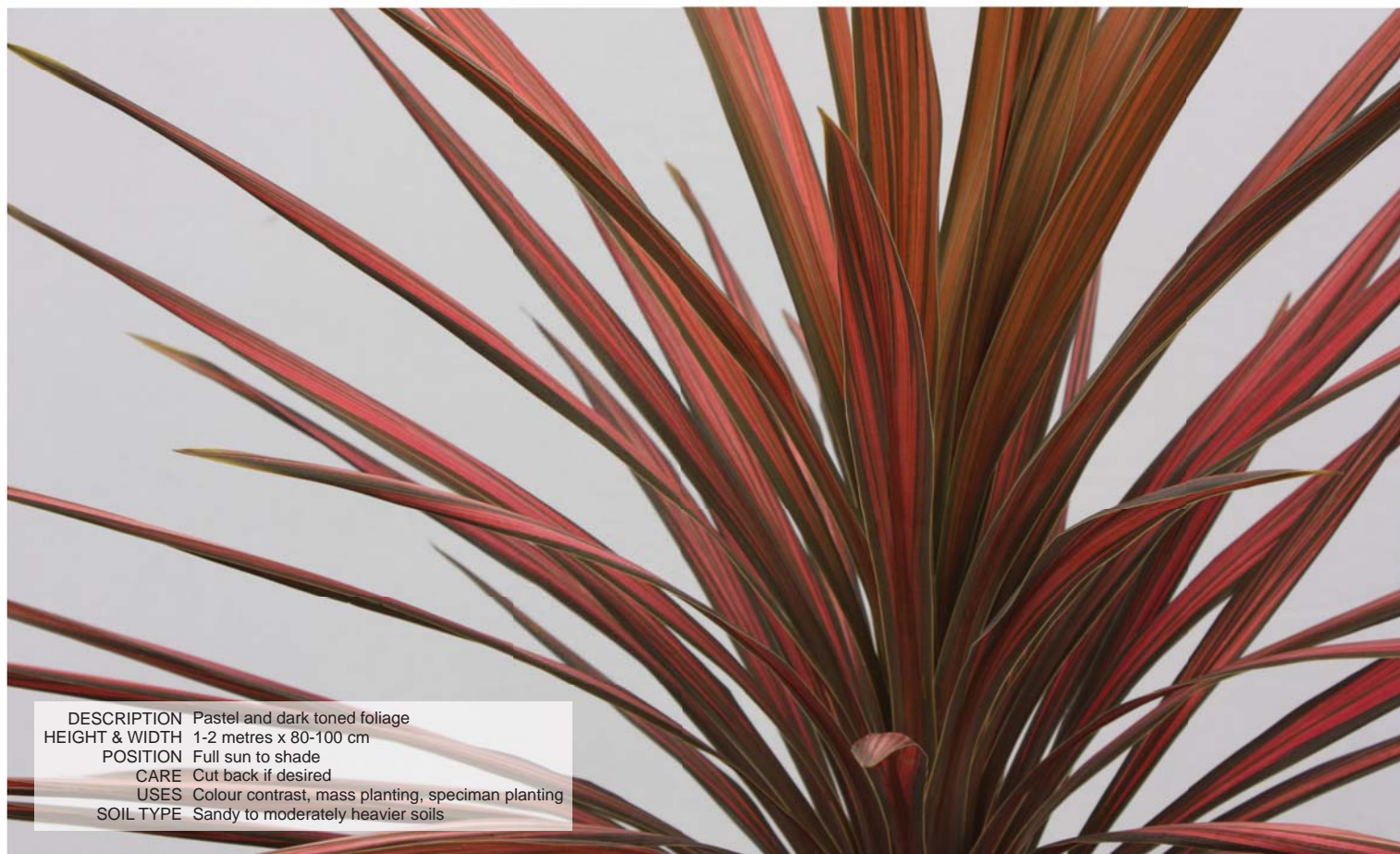
Darker pastel colours for subtle designs.

Not every landscape calls for vivid colour contrast. Often a more pastel colour is required to contrast with the greens of the landscape, and Coral does this perfectly. Whether used on mass, or as a feature plant, the Coral pastel pinks and the darker brownish green tones provide the natural contrasts often needed in a landscape. If a more vivid contrast is needed, then Sunrise does that better, but you do not always want eye catching colours, you often need subtle foreground and background contrasts. Coral is tougher than most Cordylines, less likely to burn in the sun and discolour in the cold like many do. It is a variety that with age gets a smaller trunk, and as it gets much older the trunk elongates. Coral responds very well to ground pruning, so if you desire a plant without trunks, cut it back to 15cm above the ground in Spring or Autumn. It will then re-shoot from a lower point. This may need to be done each 4 or 5 years.
